




Real vs Fake

- ▶ In Alberta states that it is against the law to paint a wooden ladder.
- ▶ In Alberta, it is illegal to wear socks and sandals to any café.
- ▶ In Nanaimo, BC you cannot farm oysters when the tide is high.
- ▶ In BC it's illegal to kill a Sasquatch.
- ▶ In Fort Qu'Appelle, Saskatchewan it's illegal to walk down the main street with untied shoes.
- ▶ In Ontario, it is illegal to ride your bike with no hands on the handlebars.
- ▶ In Toronto, it is illegal to swear in a public park.
- ▶ Purple garage doors are against the law in Kanata, Ontario.
- ▶ In Beaconsfield, Quebec you are breaking the law if you have more than two colours of paint on your house.
- ▶ It is against the law for Taxi drivers in Halifax to wear shorts or t-shirts.
- ▶ In PEI, it is illegal to farm your own potatoes for the purpose of potato chips.
- ▶ In Canada it is against the law to buy more than 3000mL of Maple Syrup in one purchase.

 - ▶ Seatbelts must be worn by all people within a moving vehicle.
 - ▶ In Chess, white is always first to move, and players must take turns alternating moving one piece at a time.
 - ▶ The speed limit in Prince Albert is 50 km/h unless otherwise stated.
 - ▶ When skiing on a hill, a person must always wear their entry ticket in a visible area.


Rules vs Law

► Rules:

- Rules of a game or an organization apply only to participants in the game or members of the organization.

► Law:

- A law applies to all members of a society at all times.




Why do we have Laws?

- How would society function without laws?






What does law do for us?
